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Partnership, partnership, partnership....

Welcome to the Enfield Professional Development (PD) Programme for Schools for 2020-21.

The role of the School and Early Years Improvement Service (SEYIS) and Professional Development team is to identify the development needs of the schools' workforce and then coordinate the necessary provision across a growing number of partnerships and the expanding learning communities available to Enfield teachers. We continue to recognise that we have to equip the schools' workforce with the skills and knowledge they need in order that they can continue to raise achievement and make a positive difference to outcomes for Enfield's children and young people.

Collaboration and partnership with our schools continues to grow and deepen. Increasingly the capacity to deliver the programmes demanded by our schools is drawn from teachers and school leaders within our schools as well as consultants and subject associations.

This brochure covers the Summer and Autumn Terms 2020, Spring and Summer Terms 2021. There will be some additional courses planned during the year and schools will receive updates for these courses. We will publish regular updates on Enfield PD Online which can be viewed at <u>https://www.enfieldpdonline.org.uk/</u> and each school will also receive a hard copy.

This PD brochure is organised into 4 main elements:

1. The Professional Pathway – all phases

This is a range of opportunities designed to develop teachers, school leaders and school business managers. It provides professional learning opportunities for those at the beginning of their career right through to headship.

We have a well-established Headteacher Induction Programme - elements of which are also open to Deputies new to post. The Enfield Aspiring to Headship Programme has been established. We offer the NPQH on an annual basis and sponsor suitable candidates from Buy Back Schools. Once again, we are offering contributions from UCL/IOE including the innovative programme 'Leading Learning - Becoming a Powerful Catalyst of Change and Improvement' which will enable middle leaders skills to be effective challenge and improvement agents. We are also continuing with the National College Leadership Programmes, National Professional Qualification for Senior Leaders (NPQSL) as well as stand alone short courses relevant to the needs of Enfield School Leaders. Many middle leaders have now completed the Enfield Effective Middle Leaders Programme which we will continue to offer as a twilight programme.

This section now also has information regarding development opportunities for School Based Designated Child Protection staff.

Please note the PD programmes which are part of The Professional Pathway are designed for primary and secondary phases. The NQT Development Programmes are not included in this brochure as they are published as separate documents in July each year. The NQT Programmes can be viewed via NQT Manager, click Content and then click on Resources.

2. Primary Curriculum

This section includes a range of professional development opportunities designed to enhance skills in a wide spectrum of subjects. They are appropriate for staff who work in mainstream and special settings with pupils who are in the Early Years Foundation stage, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2.

Secondary Curriculum

This section includes professional development opportunities designed to enhance skills in a wide spectrum of subjects or aspects of the curriculum. 3. Special Educational Needs/Inclusion

GUIDANCE ON USING THE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

COURSE APPLICATIONS

Enfield schools - Please book by searching for the name of the course or the course code through your school's designated online "booker" at https://www.enfieldpdonline.org.uk/

NQT bookings will continue to be made via NQT Manager Enfield. To find out about our NQT CPD programme please email <u>michelle.williams@enfield.gov.uk</u>

If you do not book but turn up for a professional development session you may find that:

- you are turned away as we are frequently oversubscribed and cannot be in breach of Health & Safety Regulations if the number of attendees suddenly exceeds the capacity of the venue
- as may happen very rarely and unavoidably the course is postponed. Where this happens, you will be informed, and alternative arrangements will be made.

REGISTERS AND EVALUATION FORMS

A register for each course is prepared by SEYIS and course organisers will be asked to ensure that all attendances are recorded. Please ensure you always sign the register and provide the other details requested. These details will be used for monitoring and evaluation purposes.

The course evaluation should be completed online but there may also be paper versions available at the host venue. We need your feedback and take your comments seriously as part of our own evaluation of the training programmes. Please take the time to complete the evaluation forms so that we can respond to your views and continue to provide high quality Professional Development that keeps children's and young people's achievement at the centre of everything we do.

TRAVEL AND PARKING ARRANGEMENTS

You are responsible for your own travel and parking arrangements. *Please note we do not reimburse travel expenses/car parking fees for course attendees, this is a matter for each individual school's expenses policy.*

TRAINING VENUE FACILITIES

We make every effort to provide high quality training venues. Your feedback on these training venues is greatly appreciated. You can give us feedback about the venues via your tutor and/or Course Evaluation forms.

For some time now Enfield SEYIS has not provided lunches at day long courses. Tea, coffee and water are always provided. You will always be notified should lunch be provided. In the majority of instances there will be no food provided.

GUIDANCE ON CHARGING POLICY

The detail for each course contains information about the charges for each course. These charges can be summarised as:

- Schools and Academies that have bought back into the relevant training programme; PD (includes the Professional Pathway and NQTs), Special Educational Needs/Inclusion, Teaching Assistants and School Support Staff, and Governors will usually be able to attend at no further charge
- In the majority of cases LA Maintained Schools and Academies who have **not** bought back will be charged our standard PD rate: £90 for twilight courses, £125 for half-day courses and £250 for full-day courses
- Un-notified non-attendance will incur charges of at least £50 per nonattendee
- A very small number of courses are partly subsidised and will require an additional contribution from schools. Where this is the case it will be clearly indicated before anyone commits to that event

CHANGES TO THE PUBLISHED PROGRAMME

On the rare occasion that we may have to postpone a course due for example to severe weather conditions, or the tutor having to withdraw due to illness, every effort will be made to reschedule the event. You will be informed of the details of the rescheduled event in due course. We update Enfield PD Online on a weekly basis and in the unlikely event there are any last-minute changes you will receive an email update. Occasionally a previously advertised venue may need to be changed due to circumstances beyond our control. We will always notify <u>by</u> email those booked on.

CHARGES FOR NON-ATTENDANCE AT EVENTS

It is expected that applicants who cannot attend a course - for any reason other than Ofsted or personal illness - will give at least two working days' notice and ensure that their school based designated "booker" makes the necessary booking cancellation on their behalf or notifies us of the name of any colleague who is able to substitute. If you are unable to attend due to illness or similar unforeseen circumstances and you notify us in advance of the course, we will amend the records. If the school based designated 'booker' does not notify us, your school may be charged in accordance with the Charging Policy above as other potential attendees may well have been denied a place.

Enfield SEYIS Professional Development Programmes have to be at full cost recovery. We therefore have to issue charges to any schools who have not advised us in advance of withdrawal of previously booked colleagues from any of our programmes, courses or events. In such cases the charge per non-attendee will be at least £50. We value greatly our partnership with schools, but un-notified non-attendance is not only wasteful but also unfairly penalises other schools who could have taken your allocated place(s) had SEYIS been notified of your withdrawal(s) from any programme. This is not a punitive measure taken lightly but a means to compensate the service and all Enfield Schools for the waste of valuable resources when colleagues fail to attend without giving notice of their changed intention. We thank all our schools in advance for their cooperation and professionalism regarding this matter.

COURSE OUTLINE AND PURPOSE:

Strengthening middle leadership is a priority for many Enfield Schools. This programme is designed in response to requests from senior leaders for a lighter touch to developing middle leaders than undertaking the full NPQML. Each session is built around an identified theme which will enable participants to develop knowledge, confidence and skills to be more effective in their middle leadership role.

KEY OBJECTIVE:

- To become more effective middle leaders by better understanding your role in relation to leading and improving learning
- Over the course of the five sessions the participants will gain knowledge, skills and understanding in relation to:
 - Middle leaders' role in leading learning to include 'what must I do to be effective in relation to monitoring and accountability?'

The programme will support you to become more effective and confident in your roles by enabling you to:

- reflect on and audit your leadership skills
- understand what it means to be an effective leader of learning
- deepen and widen your understanding of how you influence, lead and manage others in the organisation
- develop the specific leadership skills and qualities needed to improve learning
- engage in a personalised project to develop and apply your leadership skills in your own organisation
- develop as a reflective learning professional.

Target audience: Middle leaders in Secondary, Primary and Special schools eg Heads of Year, phase leaders, SENCOs, subject leaders, other middle leaders such as: healthy schools, literacy across the curriculum, student voice, etc.

Learning Model : Five twilight sessions led by UCL Institute of Education colleagues Rachel Walker and Mark Quinn which will combine bursts of theory with practical activity.

Between sessions you will be expected to apply your new learning by working on an individual Leadership for Change (L4C) project. This is because we know from research that professional learning needs to be connected to professional development and practice. In other words, this programme will make the most difference to you if you take some of the learning away and apply it in your everyday practice as a leader.
