





Striving for excellence





What is the Enfield Neighbourhood Fund?

- A new fund that has been set up to help improve neighbourhoods across the borough
- Funding comes from the Community Infrastructure Levy (a charge applied to buildings and extensions to residential and commercial properties)
- Some of the money is spent on key infrastructure (e.g. road and rail) and some is spent on neighbourhoods
- The fund is worth up to £1.4m over two years (bids should generally be between £10-60k, although exceptional bids will be considered)
- Applicants will need to be able to show how their project would provide improved outcomes for residents and these should be linked to the Enfield Poverty and Inequality Commission findings

What is the Enfield Neighbourhood Fund?

The £1.4m funding will be split as follows:

	Internal Stakeholders (this includes Council departments)	External Stakeholders (this includes community representatives and charitable organisations)
Year 1 2021/22	£350,000	£350,000
Year 2 2022/23	£350,000	£350,000



What sort of projects are suitable?

- Projects should fit criteria linked to the Enfield Poverty and Inequality Commission findings
- A wide range of examples can be accessed via the website
- Projects might include:
 - improvements to streets and local green spaces
 - flood risk management solutions
 - habitat creation and restoration
 - climate change mitigation and adaptation
 - skills and training
 - community safety measures
 - festivals and events
 - new community, health and social care facilities
 - on-going maintenance and management of assets



Examples of projects for schools to consider

- Localised improvements to increase pedestrian space at schools and colleges
- Air infiltration units to tackle pollution within school classrooms
- Traffic calming measures (e.g. speed bumps and 20 mph zones) outside schools and colleges
- Provision of inclusive, outdoor spaces within school grounds
- Provision of youth outreach activities contributing towards safer schools needed because of the added pressures placed on an area by development
- Facilities for childcare
- Special educational provision (e.g. mentoring)
- Targeted support for children and young people at risk of exclusions
- In-school centres (e.g. classrooms) to support pupils at risk of exclusion
- Creative school projects to support children and families whose first language is not English
- Volunteering and training opportunities



What is the eligibility criteria?

- To be eligible, the project must meet the following criteria:
 - Bids must exceed the minimum funding threshold of £10,000
 - The delivery of the project is contingent on funding from Enfield's community infrastructure levy (as no alternative sources of funding are available).
 - The project must be located within the borough (or at least part of it).
 - The project must comply with the regulations in that it "supports the development of an area" through "the provision, improvement, replacement, operation or maintenance of infrastructure...or anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that development places on an area".
 - The project must not form part of the delivery of council's normal functions (e.g. waste refuse collection) which are financed through the mainstream budget.
 - The project must not relate solely to political/lobbying activities (e.g. fundraising) and must not directly benefit individual councillors.
 - The project lead or sponsor must live and or work in the borough. Individuals or businesses will not be considered.
 - Organisations or groups submitting bids must be registered with a regulatory body (e.g. Charities Commission and Companies House).
 - Organisations or groups submitting bids must be able to demonstrate sound financial performance and management.
 - The fund cannot be used to fund the same project twice. The project should not have significant ongoing financial/revenue implications

And a few other requirements:


- Inclusive and accessible provision (e.g. SEND and rural children)
- Provision offered to all FSM children in the local authority
- At least 4 hours for 4 days a week.
 For 4 weeks in the summer, and for a week in Easter and
 Christmas.



Easter headlines 2021

- 556 C&YP age 4-18 participated in the Easter holiday programme
- 385 from primary schools
- 171 from secondary schools
- On average C&YP attended the holiday provision for 5 days during the Easter holidays.
- 114 additional C&YP participated in the programme who were not eligible for free school meals
- Programmes took place in 8 Primary schools, 2 Secondary schools, Millfield Theatre, Oasis Community Hub and 4 youth centres
- The overall cost for the Easter programme was £147,431.75 including face to face delivery and management and coordination.
- There is a total of £1,493,520 available to Enfield for Easter,
 Summer and Christmas holidays 2021

Map of Easter provision




Enfield Ward

Summer programme

- Deadline for applications was 10th May
- 15 applications were submitted some are partnerships so located in multiple locations
- Working with providers to ensure all elements of the DfE requirements can be achieved
- Provisional number of places for FSM C&YP if all applications are successful is 7,000 over six weeks and programmes are located in the wards where the need is highest
- Two sports providers require a venue
