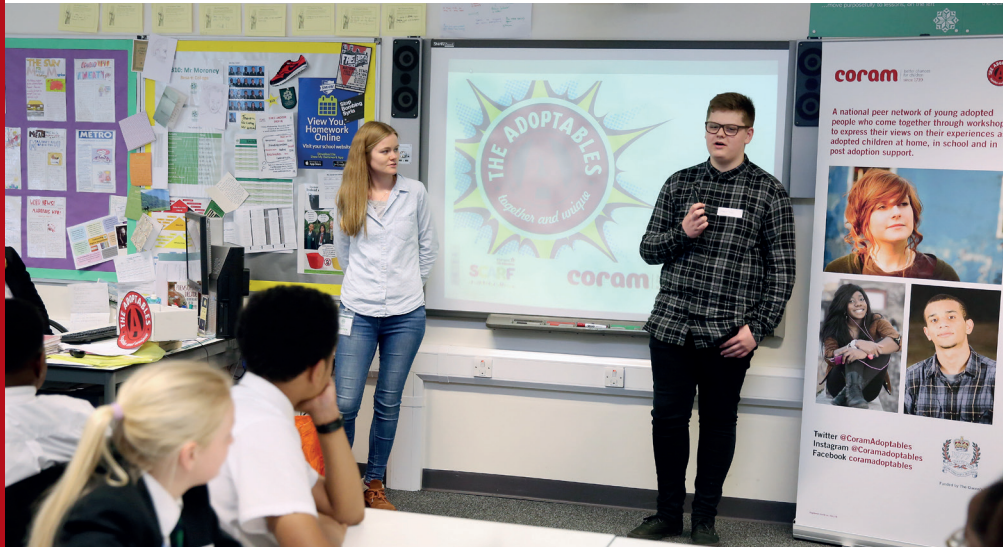

The Adoptables' Schools Toolkit offers schools the opportunity to:

-  **Enable** your students to understand the issues facing adopted children at school
-  **Increase** staff awareness of behavioural issues that can affect young people from the care system
-  **Enrich** your school's values, helping children to empathise with others and respect diversity
-  **Enhance** Personal, Social, Health and Economic education by focusing on the PSHE Association's programme of study: Relationships, Health and Wellbeing, and Living in the Wider World

The Adoptables' Schools Toolkit, which has been quality assured by the PSHE Association, aims to improve the experience of school for adopted children and young people. It has been co-produced by the Adoptables, a peer network of young adopted people, alongside specialist educators Coram Life Education and in consultation with teachers.

The Toolkit, supported by The Queen's Trust, uses:

- Short films, featuring the experiences of adopted young people in school
- Interactive lesson plans and teaching resources specifically designed for Key Stage 2 and Key Stage 3 pupils

At Key Stage 3, the Toolkit can also include:

- The participation of a peer educator who is part of The Adoptables network
- An information pack
- Signposting to further training
