Tree planting in Enfield Chase

Enfield Council are working with Thames21 on the biggest woodland creation project in London. We are planting 100,000 trees in Enfield Chase to help slow the flow of water running into the Salmons Brook, reduce pollution, alleviate flood risk and improve the resilience of Enfield in the face of climate change.

We want to give schools in the Borough the chance to get involved in this exciting project and learn about the important role trees play in tackling environmental issues.

We would like to offer you:

- A classroom session or assembly focussing on trees and the associated benefits to planting more of them; reduced flood risk, climate mitigation, improved water quality and greater social and wellbeing
- A tree planting activity in your school grounds
- A trip to Enfield Chase to get involved in the planting there

All these sessions are completely free to join. Free minibus transport to Enfield Chase can also be provided. Any combination of the three offers above are possible. All activities will be risk assessed and delivered by experienced facilitators who are first aid trained and DBS checked. Classroom sessions can be offered between October 2021 and January 2022, while tree planting activities are available between November 2021 and January 2022.

Tree planting is suitable for years 4 and above.
