Senior Mental Health Lead in Schools DfE Training Update

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Senior mental health leads in schools and colleges can now book a DfE-funded training course

From 21 September, state funded schools and colleges can book a place on a training course to help them implement an effective whole school or college approach to mental health and wellbeing, supporting recovery from the impacts of the pandemic.

The training on offer from the DfE is nationally available. Over sixty five courses are now available for school and college senior mental health leads, for all levels of experience, learning needs and preferences. DfE is providing grants for up to a third of all schools and colleges to access training in 2020/21, as part of a commitment to offer this training to all schools by 2025.
