Where there is agreement that the risk factors can be mitigated with the existing control measures in the risk assessment to everyone's satisfaction no change is needed. Where however it is clear there is increased risk for a staff member which is not mitigated by the existing control measures support will be provided to make necessary adjustments to further mitigate those risks.
