Airborne transmission of COVID-19	Ensembles including string instruments (inc. guitar & ukulele) and keyboard instruments	Minimum 2m social distancing to be observed between tutors/school staff and between tutors/pupils during sessions.	L	Tutors can opt to wear a face covering	EMS, School staff, EMS tutors and pupils – ongoing
Surface transmission of COVID-19	Ensembles including string instruments and keyboard instruments	No sharing of any instruments unless these are left for 72 hours or wiped down between groups. Tutors should avoid touching pupils' instruments during the session – tuning of string instruments should be carried out by pupils or by tutors in advance of the session.	L	Tutors can opt to wear gloves	EMS tutors – ongoing Schools staff are responsible for cleaning of instruments where required
Airborne transmission of COVID-19	Ensembles including woodwind and brass instruments	Minimum 2m social distancing to be observed between tutors/school staff and between tutors/pupils during sessions. Pupils should be staggered within the space so not positioned directly in front of each other and should not be facing each other. Ideally, pupils should also be distanced from each other by at least 1m.	М	Tutors can opt to wear a face covering	School SLT and EMS Tutors – ongoing

Surface transmission of COVID-19	Ensembles including woodwind and brass instruments	Teaching spaces should be well-ventilated during and after sessions. No sharing of any woodwind or brass instruments. Tutors should avoid touching pupils' instruments during the session. If absolutely necessary, hand sanitiser should be used before and after. Airborne transmission of COVID-19	Ensembles including singers	<ul> <li>Minimum 2m social distancing to be observed between tutors/school staff and between tutors/pupils during sessions.</li> <li>Pupils should be distanced from each other by at least 1m, should be staggered within the space so not positioned directly in front of each other, and should not be facing each other.</li> <li>Teaching spaces should be well-ventilated during and after sessions.</li> </ul>	Μ	Tutors can opt to wear a face covering	School SLT, EMS tutors and pupils – ongoing
Airborne/surface transmission of COVID-19	Tutors who are extremely clinically vulnerable (CEV), or live with a household member who is extremely vulnerable	The shielding programme has come to an end, and those who were previously considered CEV are now advised to follow the same guidelines as others as a minimum.	Μ	Tutors who are CEV should speak to the Head of EMS if they have significant concerns about continuing to teach in schools and/or have been advised differently by a specialist. <ul> <li>Tutors who have higher risk factors to Covid-19 such as:</li> <li>Shielding staff</li> <li>Clinically vulnerable (over 70 or underlying health conditions)</li> <li>Pregnant</li> <li>BAME</li> <li>Carer for a vulnerable person</li> <li>Men over 40</li> </ul>	Tutors with protected characteristics Emerging evidence suggests that alongside underlying he alth conditions, there are key demographic factors that can affect people's vulnerability or is a 'risk factor' in relation to COVID-19. The causes of these increased risk factors are not yet fully understood, and further research is taking place.	Tutors who have concerns about additional risk factors should discuss these concerns with the Head of EMS. Where there is agreement that the risk factors can be mitigated with the existing control measures in the risk assessment to everyone's satisfaction no change is needed. Where however it is clear there is increased risk for a staff member which is not mitigated by the existing control measures support will be provided to make necessary adjustments to further mitigate those risks.	L	Tutors can opt to wear a face covering and/or gloves whilst teaching and potentially teach from behind a screen	EMS/EMS Tutors - ongoing
Access for tutors with disabilities	Disability might impact on how tutors can move around the building or use an adjusted workplace	Tutors who have concerns about their ability to access teaching spaces should contact the Head of EMS to discuss this further.	L		EMS/EMS tutors - ongoing
Tutors with COVID-19 symptoms and potentially spreading to staff and others	Everyone	Tutors who develop symptoms should inform the Head of EMS as soon as possible and should not attend any schools. Tutors should inform the Headteacher immediately if they become unwell whilst in a school, and also subsequently notify the Head of EMS.	L		EMS tutors - ongoing
