Tutors who have concerns about additional risk factors should discuss these concerns with the Head of EMS. Where there is agreement that the risk factors can be mitigated with the existing control measures in the risk assessment to everyone's satisfaction no change is needed. Where however it is clear there is increased risk for a staff member which is not mitigated by the existing control measures support will be provided to make necessary adjustments to further mitigate those risks.	L	Tutors can opt to wear a mask and/or gloves whilst teaching and potentially stand behind a screen.	EMS/EMS Tutors - ongoing

Access for tutors with disabilities	Disability might impact on how tutors can move around the building or use an adjusted workplace	Tutors who have concerns about their ability to access teaching spaces should contact the Head of EMS to discuss this further.	L	EMS/EMS tutors - ongoing
Tutors with COVID-19 symptoms and potentially spreading to staff and others	Everyone	Tutors who become symptomatic should inform Paula Warren and/or the Head of EMS as soon as possible and should not attend the Saturday Music Centre. Tutors should inform Paula Warren immediately if they become unwell whilst at the Saturday Centre. Tutors should follow the latest Government guidance on self-isolation if they display any symptoms of COVID-19. If a tutor is a household contact of someone who becomes symptomatic, the tutor should follow the relevant Government guidance depending on vaccination status: https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus- covid-19/self-isolation-and-treatment/when- to-self-isolate-and-what-to-do/ Tutors should inform the Head of EMS and Paula Warren as soon as possible if they if they test positive for Covid-19. Pupils with COVID-19 symptoms and potentially spreading to staff and others	Everyone	If a pupil becomes symptomatic during a lesson or rehearsal, tutors should call reception on 07903 970407 so a member of staff can escort the pupil to an isolated area and contact a parent/carer to collect the pupil.
		Any tutors/staff assisting the pupil whilst awaiting collection should wear a face covering at all times.
		Parent/carer should be advised to follow Government guidance on testing for those with symptoms, and to report the test results to EMS as soon as possible.
		Any surfaces touched by the pupil should be cleaned immediately after they have left, including those in the teaching space.
		Staff/tutors who attended to the pupil do not need to self-isolate unless the pupil subsequently tests positive and they are asked to do so by test and trace.
