

Education Inspection Framework (EIF) Key areas

Inspection is always a judgement call, there is **no** '**recipe**' which can explain all the circumstances that might affect such a judgement.

Timing of inspections

- Good schools will be inspected within seven years from the end of the school year in which the school was last inspected.
- Section 5 inspections are now called graded inspections, section 8 is now called ungraded.
- Outstanding schools (previously exempt) will all be reinspected by 1st August 2026
- Ofsted may also use ungraded inspection powers to conduct 'no formal designation' inspections of any school where serious concerns have arisen at any point in the inspection cycle.

Sources of evidence

In advance all relevant information held by Ofsted, including:

- data from inspection data summary report (IDSR) (2019)
- Work force census data
- Previous inspection reports
- Surveys, monitoring letters or warning notices
- any qualifying complaints made about the school to Ofsted
- replies to questionnaires, including Parent View
- information on provider information portal
- most recent inspection report on the local authority's children's services
- main findings from the local area's SEND inspection relevant publicly available information e.g. school website
- information published by local authorities, the DfE (including the Education and Skills Funding Agency and RSC) & police.

And of course...

Googling!

On the day

- More conversations with pupils focussed on learning, wellbeing and safeguarding;
- More conversations with middle leders re: curriculum choice;
- More looking at work in books to see evidence of delivery;
- Evidence of the work of governors and their priorities (in particular minutes);
- Meetings with chair and as many other governors as possible.



Website

- It is your "shop window" display your school to advantage;
- How easy it is to navigate?
- There will be an emphasis on curriculum, so make sure that is up to date and gives relevant detail;
- Does your curriculum give an indication of progress and what is really being taught?
- The statutory curriculum is not just national curriculum subjects. It is the national curriculum plus RE, RSE/PSHE, FBV, CEIAG and collective worship.

Senior leaders

Curriculum intent. Understanding of implementation and impact.

Curriculum leaders

Long- and medium-term thinking and planning. Rationale for content choices and sequencing.

Lesson visits

Evaluate where a lesson sits in a sequence, and leaders'/teachers' understanding of this.

Work scrutinies

of pupils in observed classes. Where possible, jointly with teachers/leaders.

Teachers

Understand how the curriculum informs their choices about content and sequencing.

Pupils

From observed lessons. How well do they build schema and recall learning.



Forming a view of quality of education If there is insufficient evidence, or if leaders wish to present more, we will collect additional evidence. We may also collect additional evidence to identify whether or not the strengths and weaknesses that inspectors have seen during the deep dives are systemic.

Bringing it together

Pupil Premium

- Schools must use the <u>DFE Pupil Premium templates</u> to report spending on PP; this must be completed by 31st December 2021;
- For the academic year 2021-22, schools must show how the spending strategy is informed by research evidence, referring to a range of sources, including the toolkit published by the Education Endowment Foundation (EEF). Link here.
- Activities should include those that:
 - Support the quality of teaching, such as staff PL
 - Provide targeted academic support, such as tutoring
 - Tackle non-academic barriers to success in school, such as attendance, behaviour, and social and emotional support

Political impartiality

- Schools must not allow the promotion of partisan political views and should take steps to ensure the balanced presentation of opposing views on political issues.
- Partisan political views are not limited to just political parties.
 They may also be held by campaign groups, lobbyists and charitable organisations.
- Inspectors should flag concerns about political impartiality
 with school leaders and check leaders understand why this is
 a problem and will take action to rectify any breaches.
- In most cases, findings will not be significant enough to affect an inspection judgement.

Leadership at the heart of everything

Leadership and management: grade criteria for 'Good'

 Leaders have a clear and ambitious vision for providing high-quality education to all pupils. This is realised through strong, shared values, policies and practice.

Big questions...

- Is the vision clear and ambitious?
- Does the whole community understand and share the vision?
- How effectively are systems, policies and processes in place?
- How well are leaders assuring themselves that the vision is happening consistently across the school?

Vision / Actions / Impact



Safeguarding – the right culture

- How does the school identify children who are at risk?
- What timely action is taken, and how well do they work with other agencies?
- How do governors and staff manage their statutory responsibilities, including responding to allegations about staff or adults?
- Is the school alert to risks in their locality?
- It is not a tick box exercise, most weight will be given to the evidence that shows impact on pupils, staff and parents.

SFRVICE

 Inspectors should be free to speak to pupils about safeguarding without any other adults present.

SBMs

- Before the call, paperwork, support for the head
- During SCR, talking to inspectors, getting info together, supporting the process
- Surveys pupil/staff/parents make sure they go out!

Budgets 2023/24

July 22	Notification of indicative funding information
Early - October 22	Present initial assessment to the Schools Forum Initial assessment: per pupil led increase varies between 0 - 2.9%
Mid-October 22	Local consultation
December 22	Final Budget Settlement received from ESFA
Mid-January 23	Indicative allocation presented to Schools Forum for agreement, then submitted to ESFA for Validation
Late January 23	Indicative Budget available to schools
Late Feb / Early March 23	Formal budget notification

Changes that impact budget:

- strategic level: resources available
- School level: pupil nos., contextual data, e.g. pupils eligible for FSM

Financial Pressures

- Pending pay awards: teachers up to 5%, support staff up to 10%, costs pressures and inflationary increases
- 2023: Actuarial review of Employers pension contributions for both teachers and support staff

HSBC Update

 A banking FAQs document is being finalised and will be circulated to schools asap. Will include guidance on mandate changes etc

Closedown 2022/23

- Earlier statutory deadline, 31st May rather than 31st July for 21/22
- Deadline likely to be Fri 21st April 2023 but will be confirmed
- Capital needs to be finalised before revenue so information will be required by Fri 24th March. A capital workbook and funding statement will also be required with Q3 monitoring return. Details to follow
- Full details and guidance will be circulated as soon as possible




