

Ashiana & Tender Teacher Training Opportunity

We have been generously funded by the Violence Reduction Unit to deliver free, high-quality training to 28 educational settings across London, addressing the needs and vulnerabilities of girls and young women at risk of abuse.

Our training programme has been specially designed to build staff capacity to identify and respond to violence against women and girls (VAWG) and complements the new mandatory Relationships and Sex Education curriculum.

Who are Ashiana and Tender?

Ashiana and Tender have a demonstrable track-record of partnership working in the domestic abuse sector, working together for over 9 years in delivering educational projects.

Project Information

This CPD accredited programme consists of 7 modules ranging between 1 – 3 hours in length, and delivery can be tailored to suit the time and resource needs of your setting.

Your staff will receive specialist training on key topics including Domestic Abuse Awareness, Child-on-Child Abuse, Harmful Practices, Intersectional and Trauma-Informed Approaches, and Online Harms.

These topics are currently high priority for Ofsted and [Keeping Children Safe in Education 2022](#).

Our core aims are to equip your staff with:

- Improved knowledge of domestic abuse and gender-based violence, and how these issues impact young people;
- Practical tools for promoting healthy relationships, empathy, and equality throughout the school environment;
- Empowerment to safeguard and support girls and young women who may be at risk of, or experiencing, violence and abuse.

Our experienced Project Coordinators will hold all administration for the project, and training sessions will be delivered by experienced Workshop Facilitators (OCN Level-3 accredited or equivalent) with expert knowledge in domestic abuse and healthy relationships.

All training sessions can be delivered either in-person, online via Zoom, or through a blended approach to best suit the needs and busy timetables of your school.

Ultimately, this training programme aims to support teachers and youth practitioners to create safer spaces for young women and girls in educational settings.
