Founded in 1955, the Enfield Archaeological Society is active in carrying out research and fieldwork in and around the London Borough of Enfield, in order to understand and preserve its history. Their main aims are: to promote the practice and study of archaeology in the district; to record and preserve all finds in the borough and encourage others to allow their finds to be recorded by the Society; and to co-operate with neighbouring societies with similar aims.

School workshops:

The Enfield Archaeological Society offer school workshops at certain archaeological sites throughout Enfield.

Elsyng Palace: Taking place in the grounds of Forty Hall, pupils will be able to take part in different challenges to uncover the history behind the forgotten palace once belonging to King Henry VIII. They will work and handle real artefacts found at the site and work together to work out what they may have been used for. They will be able to visit the excavation site to watch the live digging take place and take part in a Q&A with real archaeologists.

Chickenshed Theatre





Chickenshed is a pioneering and inclusive company that makes beautiful and inspirational theatre. They bring together people of all ages and from all backgrounds to produce outstanding theatre that entertains, inspires, challenges and informs both audiences and participants alike. Their vision is a society that enables everyone to flourish,

School workshops, key stages, capacity and cost:

Workshops and training opportunities aim to seek to discover and champion the strengths of the individual to find ways to bring everyone together as a group. When everyone's unique skills are bought together, we're able to create something meaningful as one. Chickenshed have worked with many primary, secondary and SEN schools in the past.

Some of our workshops include:

- Voices and Choices: an Anti-Gang Violence and Anti-Bullying Transition Project for Primary School pupils in Year 5 and 6 which teaches children the importance of choosing a positive role model, being a positive role model and contributing to their school community. The project consists of 3 workshops with 1 workshop per week in the same slot. It may be possible to do more than 1 workshop over the course of a day. Each workshop can accommodate 2 classes or 60+ pupils. Each workshop runs for 1 hour and 15 minutes and begins with a 25 minute presentation or performance to inspire pupils. Primary schools with a feeder school relationship with their secondary school are able to take part in a fourth workshop. The students would be given the opportunity to collaborate with a Year 8 class to allow the younger children to experience working alongside positive role models. Primary schools wanting to pursue this option would need to contact their secondary school partners to help facilitate this link. This project has a cost of £1200.
- Day One- Big School: Supporting pupils to think about what would make schools and communities safer for children from negative influences, bullying and being exploited.
- **Crime of the Century:** Crime of the Century is a hard-hitting, raw piece of theatre which explores the issues surrounding gang violence. Using words and movement alongside a contemporary score of hip-hop and dance music, the performance packs a frightening punch and acts as a positive tool in the fight against the savagery of knife crime. The performance lasts 50 minutes and the workshop lasts up to 1 hour and 15 minutes. The workshop is suitable for pupils in Year 7 upwards.
- **Bespoke Workshops:** Where there is a desire to explore a specific themes or issues, we are able to create bespoke workshops delivered as a one-off session or through a series of workshops.

Tales from the Shed





Tales from the Shed is an Early Years and Primary overarching programme which uses storytelling, music, movement, puppets, historical and scientific facts and child-led exploration with many component projects within it. TFTS have worked with early year's experts for over three decades and their diverse team present interactive and inclusive shows/workshops which help promote cognitive development in young children. These projects have been used within Enfield and nationally with excellent feedback and high level grading by Educational Bodies.

Projects currently running include Tales from the Rainbow, with six Edmonton educational settings. This project uniquely uses the seven colours of the rainbow to support children's physical, socio emotional and language development through puppetry, movement, music and dance. These shows are supported by educational resources, including a pack of Blurgh playing cards, colour in Blurgh activities and video links to Blurgh dances, BSL translations and Activities for the children to do in their home settings and in their classrooms.

Tales from the Past and Future – an inter-generational project bringing school children and older people together in care homes and community settings. This multi-stranded project will look at shared tales through the eyes of children and seniors alongside hopes for the future and has had an amazing run with Enfield Community Partnership. All sessions are bespoke to fit the physical and educational requirements

Tales from the Shed have also worked on Projects with V & A, The Old Vic, The National Gallery, National Literacy Trust, Museum of London, The Scouts, BETTS conference, and Legoland New York!

School workshops:

Workshops can run from 1 hour to a whole day. They also offer multiple sessions over a longer term project.

- Tales From the Rainbow and Tales From the past and Future (as outlined above)
- Bespoke workshops for SEND
- Training programmes in high educational establishments.
- One off or seasonal workshops and shows.
- And everything in between!

National Curriculum:

The programme encompasses the EYFS areas of learning throughout our programme to help support and enhance young children's: Communication and Language, Literacy, Mathematics, Expressive Arts and Design, Understanding the World, Physical Development and their Personal, Social and Emotional Development.





Face Front Theatre- Ray Downing







As an Enfield-based inclusive theatre charity, Face Front takes issue-based productions into primary, secondary and special schools. Each production is designed to explore themes that are crucial to the children and young people, such as making the transition from school to adult life, and experiencing domestic violence. As well as performances by professional actors, each session includes a workshop and teacher pack. The aim is to deliver theatre experiences that not only raise awareness, but also enable the children and young people to engage in the process of change. Face Front reach approximately 3,000 students annually.

School workshops:

Session 1: Whisper Me Happy Ever After

Outline: With a cast of four actors, a facilitator and a counsellor, 'Whisper Me Happy Ever After' is a play is about domestic violence. It's based on a family, and focuses on the behaviour, feelings and development of the children. This allows the 'child-pupil' audiences to identify with the characters, enabling them to develop personal insight and gain knowledge. The production includes a 43-minute performance followed by a facilitator-led session when the audience helps the characters make different decisions at key junctures of the show. This results in a much happier outcome for the protagonists (a brother and sister who live in a home where domestic violence occurs). Using this type of 'Forum theatre' gives the audience a model for how to respond in similar situations. Children are not told how to act, but are shown the positive consequences of asking for help. Crucially, after the show, the audience is encouraged to come and talk to the cast, facilitator and counsellor.

Aims

- 1. To develop strategies for dealing with violence in the home to increase resilience, reduce stress, improve general emotional wellbeing and school attendance.
- 2. To raise awareness about domestic violence, teaching peer support skills and informing children about how to get help and support.
- 3. To prevent future domestic abuse by confronting the emotional and legal consequences.
- 4. Additional resources: We provide a teacher's pack of ideas and sign-posting information, a poster for the school and cards with information about help for all pupils

National Curriculum links: PHSE, English, Drama, oracy & safeguarding

Session 2: It's My Move

Outline: 'It's My Move' features five learning-disabled performers, and follows the lives of a group of disabled young people who are about to leave school. It focuses on the choices they're making, who is influencing them and the dilemmas they face. The production uses a Forum Theatre style, where the audience explores how to make positive outcomes by changing the actions of the characters. It also uses multiple communication tools including Makaton (sign-language), music, movement, poetry and film.

Aims:

- 1. To reduce stress and anxiety around transition for young people with learning difficulties and disabilities (LDD) and their carers.
- 2. To help young people express their choices and for carers and professionals to listen.
- 3.To improve understanding of the local offer and the Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP).

Additional resources: They provide teacher's notes with exercises and ideas based on the play, and a downloadable film for parents/carers to use with their young person.

Enfield People's Theatre- Lynda Brennan





Lynda Brennan has spent time in education as Head of Drama and Head of Year as well as

Assistant Headteacher. Post retirement, they set up two Community Theatre groups: Tottenham

Theatre and Enfield's People's Theatre. They work in partnership with various community groups and secondary school pupils and are a passionate advocate of the arts in schools as a creative

expression but also a profound learning tool.

School workshops:

Breathless Play: This play was written for and about young people. Breathless is loosely based on

the tragic story of Ella Adoo Kissy Debra, a nine year old girl who died from asthma exacerbated

by the pollutants from the South Circular Road traffic. Breathless is set in 2023/24 and beyond in an authoritarian world where traffic rules and oxygen is in short supply. The play explores why

many young people feel a need to protest. The play lasts 45 minutes and has an audience

discussion built in.

Workshop: A workshop on PSHE and Citizenship issues including themes of anti-bullying,

climate justice and assertiveness. The play's three central themes - clean air, climate change and

the right of people to protest – are explored.

National Curriculum and Key Stages:

KS3 and KS4- Science and PSHE.

School workshops:

of this work upon students will be seen across all subjects.

For secondary schools, workshops last up to 2 hours. For primary schools, workshops last up to 1

hour. They offer individual workshops and programmes of workshops. The workshop

programmes can be tailored. They offer programmes of 4-10 sessions and can provide ongoing

programmes of workshops.

National Curriculum and Key Stages:

The workshops particularly link to areas of the curriculum including Poetry, Creative Writing and

Public Speaking. These workshops are suitable for pupils in EYFS, KS1, KS2, KS3, KS4, and KS5.





School workshops, National Curriculum links, key stages and capacity:

In addition to the following, bespoke workshops can be developed to fit a particular topic or area of the curriculum. Hana has considerable experience working with scientists, festivals and others to develop creative activities with different themes and constraints.

Shape and symmetry: In this workshop you will get to design your own mathematical mandala incorporating design ideas from traditional mandala shapes and patterns. • Workshops and programmes can be tailored to support any part of the National Curriculum and they offer bespoke and flexible approach to suit specific needs.

Key Stages:

- Tiger Monkey works with children aged 5 upwards in schools and all key stages including SEND. They work inclusively and offer accessible workshops for all.
