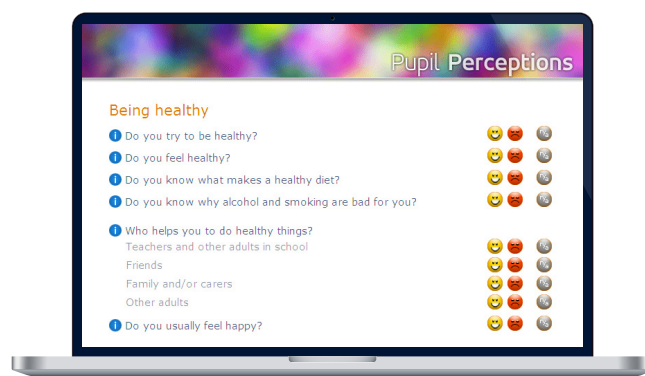
Supporting learning and wellbeing
