

London Safeguarding Procedures

London Safeguarding Children Procedures

These procedures are routinely reviewed every 6-12 months. The latest review took place on the 30th September. There is a new chapter on sexual abuse, plus changes to following chapters: CP1, Responding to Abuse and Neglect; CP2, Referral And Assessment; CP3, Child Protection Enquiries; PG1, Roles and Responsibilities, together with minor amendments across other chapters.

Measles Epidemic Expected

A measles epidemic is predicted in London this winter due to the very low immunisation rates. Measles is dangerous and there is currently a big drive to push up MMR vaccination. Please share this message with your families:

What do I need to do?

- Check your household's MMR vaccination status you can check:
 - With your GP surgery over the phone or by email,
 - For children, in their 'Red Book' (their personal health record),
 - If you are registered, you might also be able to check online or via the NHS app.
- If your child has not had two doses of MMR vaccine, book an appointment with the Enfield School Age Immunisation Team on 020 8702 6187.

This winter the team are running MMR "catch-up" clinics in schools.

Other family members can book an appointment with their GP. If someone's vaccination status is unknown, it is safe to receive the MMR vaccine even if they have had it before.

Roald Dahl's Letter



A measles epidemic on our doorstep

Only 66% of Enfield Under 5s are double vaccinated against measles. This is far below the figure of 95% needed for herd immunity and signals the likelihood of an imminent measles outbreak this winter.

Measles is 5x more infectious than Covid, and far more dangerous. 20% of infections lead to hospital admissions and those exposed are at risk of serious brain injury, deafness, sight issues and, of course death. If you are unvaccinated and exposed to measles you will need to isolate for 21 days.

The MMR vaccine is safe and effective and leads to lifelong immunity in almost all cases. It is never too late to get vaccinated.

What can schools do? Encourage families to check their vaccination records – particularly if only one does has been received and not both - and to **book immunisation appointments as soon as possible.**

Safeguarding Signs: Online Safety

? What is it?

Contact (e.g harmful interactions or grooming) Commerce (e.g. online gambling, scams or phishing)

Four broad categories of harm/risk →

- Occurs via different online channels (e.g. social media or gaming)
- · Links to other forms of child abuse

Content

(e.g. exposure to harmful material)

Conduct

(e.g. cyberbullying or sharing of nude images)

Things to Look Out For

More time spent using technology

Secretive behaviour about Internet use

Upset, withdrawn or angered behaviour after Internet use

Having many new online contacts

Unexplained new possessions

Talking about or **acting out topics** that they would ordinarily have no knowledge of

Other signs of abuse that occur when children and young people are being **bullied**, **exploited** or **radicalised**



Listen Out For

Names of online games/apps... social media challenges... online celebrities/influencer names... talk about images being shared

Take opportunities to teach online safety

Keep yourself up to date and engage with training

Questions we've been asked this week

Q: Do we have to keep a separate record of times when restraint has been used?

No, you no longer need to do this. You do, however, need to record details on your record keeping system and should investigate any incident to a) ensure actions were appropriate and proportionate, referring to the LADO if needed, and b) to identify causes of crisis in order to prevent future incidents from occurring. We would also highly recommend that staff are safe restraint and positive behaviour management trained. Team Teach, Price and Cozi are all examples of good quality training.
