

Disrupting Exploitation Programme – SEND Curriculum Workshop

The Children's Society's Disrupting Exploitation programme have developed a curriculum on county lines exploitation for children with special educational needs. Alongside West Lea school, the Disrupting Exploitation Programme at The Children's Society is offering an introductory on the SEND curriculum for all secondary schools in Enfield. This document outlines our offer in more detail as well as what our expectations of schools would be should they be interested in teaching the curriculum next term.

Our offer

We will deliver a workshop for teachers and school staff about the SEND curriculum resources, and how to teach it to children with SEND. We will offer this alongside a wider package of support as outlined below.

Content of workshop

- Overview of SEND Curriculum resources
- Overview of key themes covered in the curriculum, such

as signs of grooming and exploitation

- Risks associated with exploitation
- Where to go for support

Accompanying SEND training

In addition to the above, West Lea school will provide a specific training session on how to teach the curriculum to children with SEND and the best way to deliver the lessons. This is to enable teachers to deliver the lessons in a SEND friendly way:

- To create an understanding of the types of difficulties children and young people with special educational needs may experience.
- To understand what is meant by communication difficulties and to know the difference between

receptive and expressive language

 To learn strategies for effectively communicating with children and young people with special educational needs including the use of visuals and Comic Strip Conversations

Supporting resources

For the school – our exploitation awareness toolkit provides training to upskill school staff through short training videos on exploitation, unconscious bias and trauma informed practice. It also provides lesson plans and resources for delivering



sessions on exploitation to pupils. This is available at https://tinyurl.com/ExploitationAwarenessToolkit.

Our expectations of the school if participating in pilot rollout

- Participation in a training session on the curriculum
- Filling out a questionnaire pre teaching curriculum to assess how staff feel currently about teaching students about exploitation
- Filling out a questionnaire post curriculum to see how this has changed or optional participation in a reflective/learning session
- Providing feedback from students about the curriculum or optional participation in observations sessions on how their understanding of exploitation has developed/changed, if it has done so.
