HOT TOPIC: ChatGPT and AI Chatbots

Chatbots are a type of artificial intelligence designed to interact with users in a conversational manner. Unlike Googling a question, an AI chatbot gives more context to the answer. So, instead of providing a list of links or a short sentence or two for an explanation, chatbots can give an extensive answer that you can build on and refine through conversation. The DSL Handbook is designed to explain the Prevent referral process and statutory responsibilities to keep children, young people and adult learners safe from the risk of extremist ideology or radicalisation.

ACT for Youth: RUN HIDE TELL

Counter Terrorism Policing have collaborated with specialists from the PSHE Association to take terrorism safety advice into the UK's classrooms and youth organisations for the first time.



Security experts from Counter Terrorism Policing have commissioned the creation of an animated core film designed to teach young people how to react if caught up in an a gun or knife terror attack. The film aimed at 11 to 16 year olds will also show them what to do if they see suspicious behaviour or a suspicious item.
