A whirlwind guide to... Medical Needs

Overview:

The “**Supporting pupils with medical conditions at school**” guidance came into force in December 2015. It is statutory and is aimed at schools and governing boards. The “**Education for children with health needs who cannot attend school**” was last updated in December 2023. This guidance outlines how schools can best support pupils who cannot attend school. Parts of it are statutory. It is aimed at schools, governing boards and local authorities.

Key points from the statutory guidance:

- Pupils at school with medical conditions should be properly supported so that they have full access to education, including school trips and physical education.
- Governing bodies must ensure that arrangements are in place in schools to support pupils at school with medical conditions.
- Governing bodies should ensure that school leaders consult health and social care professionals, pupils and parents to ensure that the needs of children with medical conditions are properly understood and effectively supported.
- All pupils have the right to access high quality education even if they are unable to attend school

Further advice:

Children and young people with medical conditions are entitled to a full education and have the same rights of admission to school as other children. This means that no child with a medical condition can be denied [admission](#)⁷ or prevented from taking up a place in school because arrangements for their medical condition have not been made. However, in line with their safeguarding duties, governing bodies should ensure that pupils’ health is not put at unnecessary risk from, for example, infectious diseases. They therefore do not have to accept a child in school at times where it would be detrimental to the health of that child or others to do so.

Checklist:

- Do you have a named person/people responsible for ensuring good practice at your school?
- Are your policies up to date?
- Are your staff trained in allergies, asthma and the use of auto injectors?
- Are your staff trained in the particular medical needs of pupils on roll?
- Do you have a procedure in place to brief supply and cover teachers?
- Are your procedures effective in ensuring children with allergies do not access food which can harm them?
- Are individual healthcare plans monitored regularly?
- Are regular checks made on life saving equipment and medication, such as asthma pumps and epi pens?
- Do you have risk assessments in place?
- Are children with medical needs able to safely access extra curricular activities, events and trips?
