

# Project Dove – an Early Help initiative

## Aims

- Improve the lives of young people, their families and community in Enfield.
- Reduce the number of cases going to A&Es or any other MDTs, reduce offending and increase access to EET.
- Increase awareness of VR amongst healthcare staff and colleagues.
- Identify those who are at risk of violence from healthcare professionals and other colleagues (internally and externally).
- Operational and delivery of VR pathway in the community by increasing accessibility to a caseworker (e.g. referrals and personalised plans).

## Referrals and Case Management

- Referrals can be submitted via the children's portal: [Make a referral \(enfield.gov.uk\)](https://enfield.gov.uk)
- I only work with young people (10- 18 years old) where they are either involved or at risk of youth violence, therefore not all referrals will meet the threshold.
- Maximum case allocation is 15, however most cases will be jointly worked as support is only for young people.
- Not all work will be 1:1 as some of it will be conducted within a group setting at school.

## Ofsted

**Ofsted** will examine the **culture of safeguarding** at your school.

They are not trying to catch you out on technicalities, but are checking the attitudes and practices at your school are effective at keeping children fundamentally safe. Ofsted's blog and handbook lay out their expectations and practices very clearly (see below), with an extract from the blog copied to the right:

## What we offer in Enfield:

A full safeguarding review can be commissioned by emailing [seyis@enfield.gov.uk](mailto:seyis@enfield.gov.uk)

Safeguarding Reviews may also take place as part of commissioning plans for Amber or Red schools or when the DfE or Ofsted has asked us to review practice at a particular school following a concern.

Typically, full reviews are conducted by Samantha Hill and will take a full day in school. It is a friendly but intense day. Schools always find these a positive, useful experience. We will meet the DSL, members of staff and groups of children, will examine the SCR, safeguarding log and other documents, and will detail strengths of the school and further recommendations. You can obtain a copy of the proforma we use by emailing [Samantha.Hill@enfield.gov.uk](mailto:Samantha.Hill@enfield.gov.uk).

We also offer a **Self Audit tool**, which we recommend schools complete and return to us as part of their annual cycle, and a **Peer Audit Tool**, which is used as part of scaffolded Triad Peer Reviews. These tools are designed to be clear, easy to use and to upskill the understanding of your senior staff as they are completed.



In terms of safeguarding, we ask schools to start by providing some specific information before the inspection – this is outlined in paragraph 107 of the handbook:

- the single central record (SCR)
- a list of referrals made to the local authority
- any referrals made to the local authority designated officer regarding staff or other adults
- a list of all open cases with children’s services or social care and all pupils who have a multi-agency plan

We specifically ask schools to provide us with ‘brief details’ about the resolution of any referrals to the local authority. To clarify, these ‘brief details’ can just be drawn from local records – for example, what support was provided and by whom, or whether the case is ongoing or the situation is now being monitored.

The records that schools draw from should have enough detail for the inspector to be able to understand the overall concerns that have been identified and the support and help that is in place for children. The exact level of detail required is explained further in paragraph 68 of KCSIE, but they should:

- be clear and comprehensive
- detail how concerns were followed up
- note any actions taken, the decision reached and the outcome

**During the inspection**

Discussions about safeguarding are woven throughout the inspection and will be informed by the information and records provided. We explain more in our [webinars](#) and the handbook, but there are a few main activities:

- reviewing the single central record
- meeting with the designated safeguarding lead (DSL)
- discussions with staff and pupils.

# The Lighthouse

[The Lighthouse : University College London Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust \(uclh.nhs.uk\)](#)

**The Lighthouse** is a service that provides a safe space to support children and young people, from 0-18, in their **recovery from sexual abuse or exploitation**. It will also support adults aged 18-25 with learning disabilities if The Lighthouse service best meets their needs. The service is provided by UCLH in partnership with the NSPCC.

The Lighthouse follows a model known as **Child House ('Barnahus')** which started in Iceland. It has been proven to help reduce children's trauma, gather better evidence from interviews and increase prosecutions for child sexual abuse. This is the first of its kind in the UK.

We accept self-referrals and referrals from professionals for children and young people in Barnet, Camden, Enfield, Haringey and Islington.

**Safeguarding Audits / Reviews:** Safeguarding audits which are carried out in a collaborative way to help the safeguarding team evaluate their practice and ensure the school is implementing a robust culture of safeguarding. Either a 1 day on site review, or 2 day in depth audit – which can be tailored to the needs of the school we are working with.

**Safeguarding Supervision:** Provided either live virtually or F2F, on an agreed frequency with supervisee, the offer can be to an individual, or for a number of individuals over 1 day.

**Online Safety:** ECP offers online safety sessions **for staff, pupils and parents**, either as a package with a session for each group (see more info [here](#)) or for an individual group of your choice (see more info [here](#)).

We work with pupils F2F, delivering bespoke sessions to each year group across the school day.
