If you are worried about a child or young person

If you have a safeguarding concern about the welfare of a child or young person, please complete a <u>Child Protection</u> <u>referral</u>. This service is also available to members of the public and families who want to self-refer for support. Please refer them to the Children's MASH (Multi Agency Safeguarding Hub) using the <u>Children's Portal</u>. If you do not have safeguarding concerns but you need to refer to another agency for early help or parenting support

refer to another agency for early help or parenting support please gain the parent's consent and complete a <u>Family</u> <u>Support referral</u>.

You can call MASH on 020 8379 5555, Monday to Thursday from 9am to 5pm, Friday 9am to 4:45pm. Out of office hours on 020 8379 1000 (select option 2 and you will be transferred to an advisor). If you have more urgent concerns or a child is at imminent risk of harm, please call the MASH in advance of completing your written referral on 0208 379 5555



I am a part of the SWERRL Team (Strengthening Wellbeing, Emotional Health, Relationships and Readiness for Learning) in Enfield.

For the last three years, I have been working to bring trauma informed practice into primary schools in Enfield using the ARC framework. I am also the lead COSIE (Restraint Reduction) trainer for all Enfield primary schools. I have developed my trauma informed practice and understanding by working in various roles in both primary and secondary settings and schools for over 20 years in Enfield, working directly with pupils, parents and school staff.

Prior to this, I worked for ten years as a classroom teacher in Soweto and central Johannesburg in South Africa. I have two adopted children so have a "lived and breathed" experience of the impact of early trauma.
