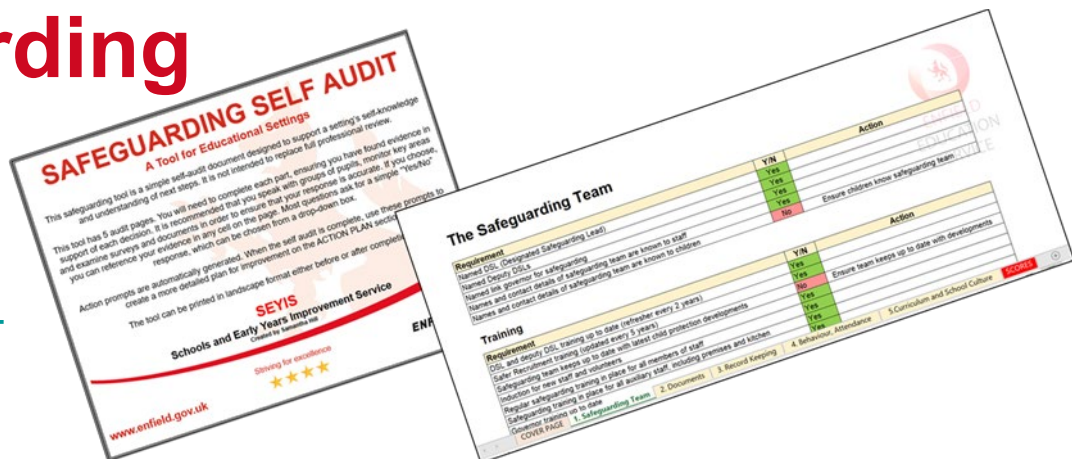

Annual Safeguarding Self Audit

Our Safeguarding Self Audit Tool is a useful review of your school's procedures and documents. Most schools complete an annual review using either this tool or an alternative document provided by their trust or partnership.

Enfield schools are expected to complete an annual safeguarding self-audit. This could be using our Enfield tool or any other document format.

Online Safety – Enfield Guidance for Schools and Parents

Our **Online Safety** materials will be available to schools **at the end of September**. These materials were developed by our Online Safety Working Party and are based firmly on current research.

We are strongly recommending that schools:

- Share the poster
- Share the accompanying leaflet
- Provide opt-out workshops for parents of children in Years R, 5, 7 and 9
- Provide practical support for parents on how to set filters and parental controls on devices

AGE 14+ for a smart phone with parental controls

*Agree a contract with your child to encourage responsible phone use

If you are worried about a child, young person or adult at risk, please use the contact information below to refer into our Children's and Adult MASH (Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub) teams.

If you are worried about a child or young person

If you have a safeguarding concern about the welfare of a child or young person, please complete a [Child Protection referral](#). This service is also available to members of the public and families who want to self-refer for support. Please refer them to the Children's MASH (Multi Agency Safeguarding Hub) using the [Children's Portal](#).

If you do not have safeguarding concerns but you need to refer to another agency for early help or parenting support please gain the parent's consent and complete a [Family Support referral](#).

You can **call MASH on 020 8379 5555**, Monday to Thursday from 9am to 5pm, Friday 9am to 4:45pm. Out of office hours on **020 8379 1000** (select option 2 and you will be transferred to an advisor). You can also **email childrensmash@enfield.gov.uk**. If you have more urgent concerns or a child is at imminent risk of harm, please call the MASH in advance of completing your written referral on 0208 379 5555

To help referrers make decisions about when to make a referral, please see the [Pan London Threshold Guidance](#).

Is your school website up to date?

You can use our website audit tool to check that all the statutory and advised information is on your site. The tool complies all the guidance into a simple form for all types of schools.

In particular, check that your statutory policies are published and are up to date.

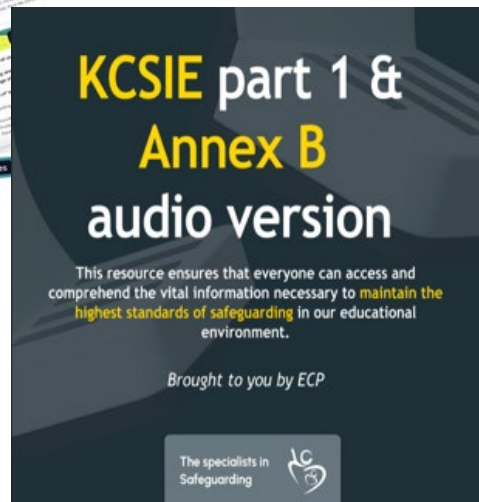

I am a part of the SWERRL Team (Strengthening Wellbeing, Emotional Health, Relationships and Readiness for Learning) in Enfield.

For the last three years, I have been working to bring trauma informed practice into primary schools in Enfield using the ARC framework. I am also the lead COSIE (Restraint Reduction) trainer for all Enfield primary schools. I have developed my trauma informed practice and understanding by working in various roles in both primary and secondary settings and schools for over 20 years in Enfield, working directly with pupils, parents and school staff.

Prior to this, I worked for ten years as a classroom teacher in Soweto and central Johannesburg in South Africa. I have two adopted children so have a “lived and breathed” experience of the impact of early trauma.
