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Hate Crime Awareness Week 2024

The **14th - 19th October 2024** is National Hate Crime Awareness Week. Schools often choose to mark the week in a variety of ways from holding assemblies, delivering lessons, fundraising / awareness raising and ensuring young people know how to report Hate Crime. The adjacent websites contain useful resources to promote National Hate Crime Awareness Week.

The **No Love for Hate** project aims to reduce the appeal of extremism to young people. It offers a positive alternative to the increasing pressure young people may feel from the world around them and the propaganda they may see online. It encourages pupils to be more accepting of others and to challenge hatred. Topics include hate crime, online risks, refugees, the rise of right-wing extremism and the push/pull factors of radicalisation.







<u>Walls</u> is a film to promote community cohesion and tackle extremism. The film and the accompanying PowerPoint slides aim to generate discussion amongst secondary school students within a PHSE lesson about hate crime, prejudice and stereotyping.

Slide packs developed by <u>Green Spring Academy</u> cover topics that range from hate crime, staying safe online, peer pressure, unhealthy relationships and respecting others. Each session could be delivered in around 15-30 minutes making them suitable for form time.

Free CPD Sessions

The following sessions are free training opportunities offered to Enfield Schools as well as other London Boroughs, funded by MOPAC. Having reviewed the sessions they are likely to be a great addition to your CPD, knowledge and skill-set. Please use discretion and your own judgement when signing up for places, as appropriate to your institution.

Exit Hate UK Virtual Sessions

Exit Hate UK are offering free, online sessions for professionals focusing on understanding the threat from the Extreme Right Wing and how this manifests in hate crime, racism, violent and non-violent extremism in our communities.



The sessions (funded by MOPAC) aim to up-skill practitioners to understand the dangers of extremism and what they can do to counter it, by creating safe spaces, providing alternative narratives and sign posting people to get help. There are two sessions a month until January - <u>click here</u> for more information and book your place.

Creating Critical Thinkers

Equaliteach are offering online CPD for teachers to explore strategies for educating young people about racism, religious intolerance and extremism. The sessions, funded by MOPAC, will look at why it is important to



educate young people about racism, religious intolerance and extremism and how to conduct effective conversations with young people on these issues. The sessions run monthly until February. Click here for more information and to book your place.

Online Platforms, Gaming and Extremist Content

On the 21st January Jennie Fisher (London's Regional Prevent Education Coordinator) is running an online training session for school staff on **Online Platforms** and Extremist Content at 1:30. The session takes a deep dive into the multiple platforms seen in Prevent referrals and includes how each site works, where
