Summary of the key points and information discussed:

1. Let's Go Zero - Holly Campbell:

The Let's Go Zero campaign aims to help all schools to be zero carbon by 2030. Let's Go Zero provides a fully funded support to schools that includes an energy advisor to help with carbon footprinting, developing a climate action plan, and finding funding for school climate programmes. Completing the new Let's Go Zero Carbon Literacy training program is also recommended for schools' climate leads.

1. ProVeg - Martin and Alex:

ProVeg's works to make school meals healthier and more sustainable, by providing more and better plant-based meals and reducing animal product consumption in schools. The "<u>Canteen</u> to <u>Classroom</u>" education program introduces the environmental and cost benefits of plant-based options through classroom activities.

The <u>School Plates Awards</u> serves as certification of contract caterers based on their sustainability efforts implemented in school meals.

2. Crown Workspace - Ann and Liv:

The <u>Giving Back Project</u> donates redundant and refurbished furniture and IT equipment to schools in the framework of the social impact strategy focused on improving employment and skills opportunities for young people in Enfield. Their projects offer support to young people such as CV writing workshops, apprenticeship programs through their volunteer programme.

3. Greener Schools - Karen and Sarah:

Greener Schools is a community interest company that aims to educate and inspire children about environmental issues through assemblies, workshops, and legacy projects with emphasis on positive and engaging environmental activities.
