A charter for early years settings, schools and colleges committed to providing an inclusive education for children and young people in Enfield.

Signing the Inclusion Charter is a commitment to:

Provide clear, visible and strong leadership for inclusion Ensure that everyone takes responsibility for including children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities Understand that all behaviour happens for a reason Listen and respond to children and young people's opinions and ideas when making any decision which impacts on their lives Celebrate difference and diversity Work with families, professionals and practitioners across our community to help all children and young people to thrive Ensure that everyone is comfortable to be open and honest about what support they need to help children and young people in their care Support children and young people to prepare for their adulthood from the early years and throughout their childhood and adolescence, so they can shape their future in the way they want. The Charter has been developed by children and young people, headteachers, teachers, parents and carers, council officers, health partners and voluntary sector organisations.

Safeguarding Basics for Supplementary Schools and Out of Hours Provisions:

- <u>After-school clubs, community activities and tuition: safeguarding guidance</u> <u>for providers - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u>
- The guidance is for any out of hours setting wherever it is held, including tuition centres, youth clubs, Scouts, language schools, sports clubs, religious lessons and after school childcare. Typically an out of hours provision must follow all guidance if they operate for 2 hours or more for 14 days a year or more.
- You cannot operate full time (preventing a child from attending school) without registering as an independent school instead
- If you accept children under the age of 8, in most circumstances you must register with Ofsted
- If you accept children 5 or under, in most circumstances you must follow the guidance of the Early Years Foundation Stage framework. This lays down very specific requirements about the number of adults and their qualifications.



Supplementary schools should:

- have an effective safeguarding and child protection policy in place
- have a **staff behaviour policy** (sometimes called a code of conduct)
- be aware of and have training on the specific safeguarding issues (including online) that can put children at risk of harm
- have clear procedures on what to do if there are concerns about a staff member, volunteer or another adult who may pose a risk of harm to children
- appoint a **designated safeguarding lead (DSL)**, who has undertaken safeguarding and child protection training, refreshing it every 2 years
- provide parents or carers with a named individual (such as the DSL or another named member of staff) so they can raise safeguarding concerns
- if you're a lone provider, give parents or carers the contact details of your local authority's children's services or the NSPCC helpline number
- know the local referral route into children's social care
- report any allegations of harm to a child to both your local authority designated officer (LADO) and the police as soon as reasonably practicable
- ensure you **follow Safer Recruitment** guidance when employing new staff or volunteers, ensuring references are appropriate and an Enhanced DBS obtained
- keep a **single central record (SCR)** of the adults on the premises
- ensure the premises used are **safe** and fire and first aid procedures are clear
- Ensure food and allergy guidance is followed
