State threats are overt or covert actions by foreign governments which fall short of direct armed conflict with the UK but go beyond peaceful diplomacy and expected statecraft to harm or threaten the safety or interests of the UK or our allies. These include attempts to steal sensitive information through espionage or cyber attacks threaten the public's safety, including through physical violence or assassinations harm our prosperity undermine our values and freedoms.



## Online Radicalisation Risks

New Home Office data, shows that school referrals to the Prevent Programme reached their highest ever level in 2024 - 2025 with a 27% increase on the year before. Schools remain the largest source of referrals, reinforcing your central safeguarding role. Senior UK Counterterrorism leaders have recently urged parents and educators to play a stronger role preventing online radicalisation. The focus is on teaching digital resilience and critical thinking skills as well as improving the understanding of harmful online influences affecting young people. Schools can play a key role in reducing online radicalisation risks by:

- Teaching digital resilience, including how to questions sources, recognise manipulation and manage online content
- Embedding critical thinking through PSHE, RSHE & Computing
- Creating safe spaces for pupils to talk openly about what they see online
